

PAUL'S TWO IMPRISONMENTS / *2 Timothy 1:1*

	First Imprisonment A.D. 60–62	Second Imprisonment A.D. 66–67
Reason	Accused by Jews and appealed to Rome	Persecuted by the Roman government
Conditions	Relatively comfortable; in a rented house (Acts 28:30-31)	Cold, dark, lonely dungeon
Relationships	Visited by many friends	Almost totally alone
Freedom	Had many opportunities to witness for Christ—eventually was freed	Was totally confined to prison but was able to read and write
Outlook	Expected freedom (Philippians 1:24-26)	Expected to be executed (4:6), but looked forward to heaven (1:12; 2:8; 4:18)
