The last chapter of Hebrews is filled with reminders. The author had explained many truths of the faith up to this point, and he didn't want his audience to forget that these should impact their lives in concrete ways. So he included a list to remind them what to do. Such reminders are important for us today as well. It is easy to forget or lose track of the responsibilities God has given us. Even people who have grown up in the church or memorized many verses need reminders of what God expects. *Remembering* what God has given us to do is the first step in *doing* it.

B What “strange, new ideas” were the Hebrews hearing about (13:9)? Why were the Hebrews susceptible to these ideas? To what kinds of strange ideas are people in your culture especially susceptible? As a part of your culture, what steps can you take to avoid being deceived by strange ideas?

C What kind of sacrifice can a Christian offer to God (13:15)? How can you offer this kind of sacrifice?

D Review all the lessons you’ve learned from the book of Hebrews. What changes in your life have these lessons made?

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
